New Business

The board reiterated their concerns regarding the board's original intent and mission. Since the federal guidelines take precedence, discussion was on whether the board's certification is redundant.

Discussion ensued on what would be beneficial to the state and would the fees sustain the board on long term plans.

Chair Weander said he felt the board was necessary to continue communication in assisting the department with training or advising with crane certification and technical advice for accident investigation.

Joaquin Diaz noted the board's limited use of the certification fees and limited scope of duties. Realizing the operators must have credentials on their job sites, he wants the board to look at programs to validate strict standards that meet the license intent. Whether it be through proxy at test sites or training classes.

Galen Lemke said certification was needed to continue and would support amending the law to support expanding the role of the board.

Diantha Goo also agreed HIOSH should support crane certification by the board with their expertise.

Director Takamine shared that neighbor island operators may also need help with training and supported developing legislation and meeting with legislators to discuss further options.

The board concluded to continue working on legislation to provide stricter overseeing of licensing, redefine the scope to include possible classes for employers and specific certifications for specific jobs. Galen Lemke will consolidate his information on what other states currently use on licensing and report back to the board.

Chair Weander said the board would develop its legislative package by October to be ready for the department to take to next year's legislature.
